A Message From District Governor Ken Emery:

What a wonderful March!! A busy month. A very special month. Thanks to Rep. Morrissey of Bennington, we, the Vermont Lions of District 45, current and former members, were honored by the State of Vermont House of Representatives for 60 years of service. 50+ Lions, Leos and Guests were welcomed into the Statehouse. Received a standing ovation from the Representatives in attendance. We all had a chance to meet with Governor Shumlin and Lt. Governor Scott. Then we had the 4th Cabinet Meeting of the year, wear we had a great Speak Out contest – 6 great participants. We also celebrated other areas of our youth we serve: Leos, Peace Poster and GMLC. LTSSA had their annual banquet for this year's game on Sunday, March 22nd.

Of a Lions Calendar year, is there any one month that is more important than another? Maybe yes? Maybe no? But if there would be one to consider such, it could be April or May.

April is the month which all clubs need to be electing their officers / board of directors for the 2015 – 2016. Each club secretary needs to file the PU 101's with LCI and District leadership, listing Club President, Secretary, Treasurer and Membership Chair AND to confirm meeting nights and meeting locations.

As of April 1st, there are only three months remaining in the 2014-2015 Lions year for each club in the district to bring in at least one new member. Of the 36 clubs in the district, 50% (that is 18 clubs) have not added one new member. As much as I would like to see each club increase their overall club membership by one, I believe it is more important to start at the beginning: GET ONE NEW MEMBER. Once one new member joins, others will follow.

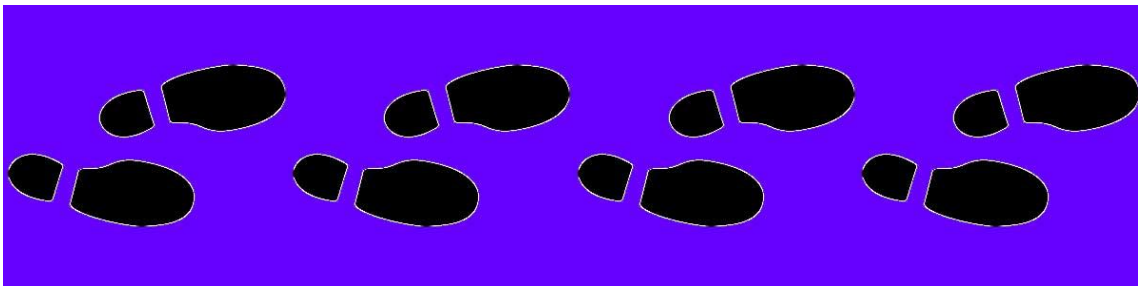

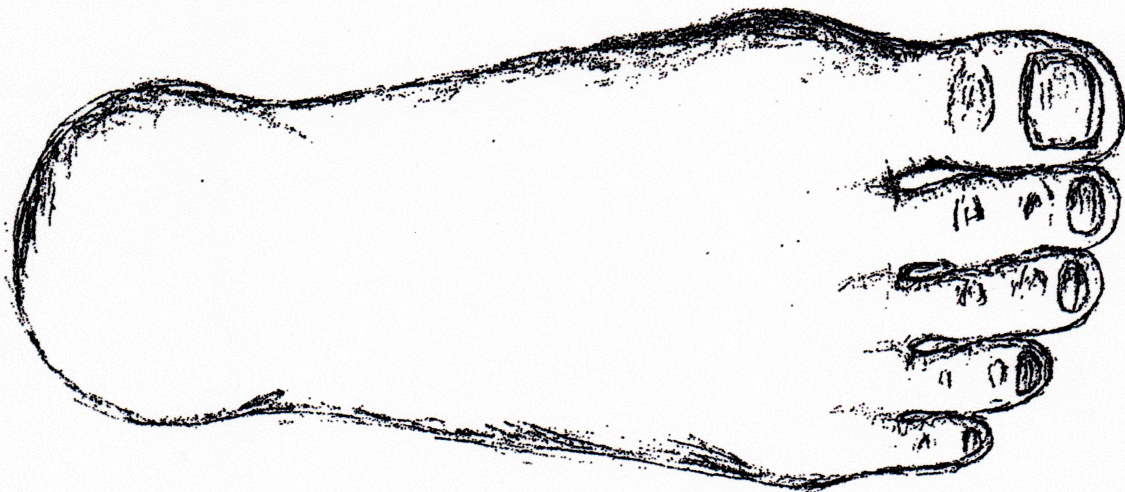

**State of Vermont
Executive Department
A Proclamation**

WHEREAS, the Lions Club was established in 1917 by a small group of Chicago businessmen for the purpose of giving back to their community; and

WHEREAS, the Lions Club soon became known as Lions Club International (LCI), and adopted the motto "We Serve;" and

WHEREAS, in 1924, Vermont's first Lions Club was established in Burlington, and was assigned to Lions District 33 also encompassing New Hampshire and western Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, following Helen Keller's address at the 1925 LCI convention, the organization's primary service mission became assisting the blind, persons with a visual impairment, as well as the deaf and persons who are hard of hearing; and

WHEREAS, in 1945, LCI realigned its jurisdictional map and transferred the Vermont Lions Clubs to a new District 44 with New Hampshire; and

WHEREAS, on June 5, 1955 at an LCI District Convention, the Vermont Lions were reorganized into their own LCI District 45; and

WHEREAS, the District 45 Lions Clubs support the LCI's International Foundation's activities, including working to eradicate measles worldwide, providing glasses to Special Olympic athletes, facilitating international disaster relief, and supporting other LCI activities, including the Sight First program, and the LCI's youth programs through the formation of Leo Clubs; and

WHEREAS, the Vermont Lions also sponsor many statewide programs that currently include the Lions Twin State Soccer Match, the Vermont Eye Bank at Porter Medical Center, the Green Mountain Lions Camp for deaf and hard of hearing children; and

WHEREAS, individual Vermont Lions Clubs also conduct locally originated service projects, including providing audiology equipment for schools, financing corrective surgeries, offering student scholarships, and purchasing eyeglasses and hearing aids for needy Vermonters; and

WHEREAS, today, LCI consists of 46,000 clubs and 1.3 million members worldwide, including the proud Lions of District 45;


WHEREAS, the Lions Club International's District 45 is celebrating its 60th anniversary;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Peter Shumlin, Governor, do hereby proclaim March 8-15, 2015 as
