Lions Clubs International

Dear Lion,

The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

After evaluating a variety of different options including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 impacts international officer continuity and candidate elections. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is outlined below:

- Executive officers and international directors will continue in their respective positions until the 2021 convention in Montreal. All candidate elections for these positions shall comply with the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws for election at the convention in Montreal.
- An international director from the areas of Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in evennumbered years. As a result, no director from Africa or Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.
- Barring any district election complaints, district governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors elected during a convention of their respective districts will be accepted by Lions International. The International Board of Directors intends to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

We are disappointed that we will not be able to move forward with this international event, but we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions we will continue to find new ways to put our kindness in action while safely serving our communities.

Elsewhere in this communique you will find an announcement in regard to the elections of District Officers for 2020 – 2021. Elections will still be held on Saturday May 2nd via video / teleconference at 2:00 p.m. Plans are being made to still have some sort of year-end celebration. As of timing of this message, the anticipated date is Sunday June 28th. Plans are to have our year-end business meeting, the annual Melvin Jones Fellows banquet, and the memorial service to honor those Lions who we have lost during the past year. Please watch for additional information as it becomes available.

It is hoped to still have the statewide speak out contest for High School students but at this time it is on hold. Major issue is when will the schools go back into session. And what free time do students have to participate in the contest.

With everything going up, please keep a positive attitude. Stay focus. Keep working with each other. Keep supporting each other. Don't be afraid to reach out to other Lions, other clubs to see what they are doing during this time.

EYEGLASS RECYCLING , Beth Abustan chair

To facilitate Vermont Lions eyeglass recycling program, the following instructions are to be followed. Please keep this is your club binder.

The glasses are collected by the individual clubs, Please take and individual plastic off the glasses.

No layering of paper, this is because the recycling center processes thousands of glasses each year and we want to make it easier for them

Clubs are responsible for writing the count on each box.

PLEASE NOTE, THIS COUNT IS TO BE GIVEN TO YOUR CLUB SECERTARY AND ENTERED INTO THE LCI REPORT.

EACH box must have the club name as they get moved around. Bring to the cabinet meetings, but NOT the Spring Convention.

The boxes are stored at the Vergennes Job Corp until they can be transported to New Jersey Recycling center.



Broken glasses ARE accepted

Sunglasses ARE accepted and do not need to be separated from non-sunglasses.

We will take the individual lens, but they are not a part of the count, and they will be tossed by the Recycling center

You do not need to wash glasses as this is taken care of by the NJ Lions processing center.

I think two initiatives of the Whitingham-Halifax Lions are good info for all D45 clubs to be aware of, and so should be considered for the next Communique that you are compiling. Doing *something* helps overcome anxiety, and so does knowing there are specific actions that one can take.

- 1. The first is our rapid switchover from physical dinner meetings to online meetings, where we safely plan together end enjoy stress-relieving fellowship from the comfort of our own homes. (See recent emails you've been copied on.) Lion Keith Thompson (who, along with his wife Alisa, has been a Lion for just a few months!) made this transition remarkably smooth.
- 2. The WHL also quickly formed a rapid response to help shut ins and others in need in our community with a brand-new <u>Wellness Initiative</u>. We will join with the Rotary club and other local organizations here in the Deerfield Valley (including the food pantry and others who help with food insecurity and the elderly). **The bones of it are outlined below.** Lion Meg Staloff from Wilmington VT is the tip of the spear in making this a reality.

Here is how their club is approaching the current epidemic:

"A motion to form a Wellness Committee, for helping those in need in the Deerfield Valley deal with the coronavirus outbreak. Volunteers may offer wellness checks, food assistance and deliveries, and other important unmet needs, particularly for shut ins. The committee will work in close coordination with other local groups. The committee will work with the Lions Financial Committee and will submit a plan to the Lions Board of Directors for approval. In order to expedite things, the club pre-authorizes the BoD's decision/approval."

Pursuant to that, we are looking for members who might want to be on that committee.

I have also made a questionnaire that will help us match bodies with tasks that need doing. There are things that involve no physical contact and can be done from home; other things would be more appropriate for members who are in a low risk group as they involve some contact and going in public to pick up groceries, etc.

Here's a quick update from the Whitingham-Halifax Lions on how we are handling the COVID-19 crisis. We are taking a <u>very</u> active role in our community.

Thought you would appreciate the info below, and might be able to use some of it (like the clip from Lion Patience Merriman) in this month's Communique.

PS: Lion Ed Metcalfe is converting his <u>Vermont Distillers</u> business over to the production of hand sanitizer, but with <u>very</u> <u>limited production</u>, *it is intended as a local source for the Deerfield Valley only*. This may ramp up in the future, as needs and materials materialize. (I'm glad I have a stash of his Maple Liquor! – delicious.) We have local Lions' news of interest that can be a help in these crazy times.

VERMONT DISTILLERS ANNOUNCEMENT FROM LION ED METCALFE:

Vermont Distillers has begun production of hand

sanitizer. Initial production will be small (500 bottles) with plans to ramp up production as soon as more supplies arrive. The sanitizer is being made according to World Health Organization standards and has a strength of 80% ethyl alcohol.

Eight ounce bottles will sell for \$6.00 (limit 2 per family at present) with \$2.00 going to the Southern Vermont Natural History Museum. Like many other businesses, the museum has lost most its income due to the cancellation of school and library programs.

The distillery currently plans to be open today (**Wednesday**) and then **Thursday thru Sunday** from 11-5 until further notice. Also, the distillery is still open for bottle sales. We have reconfigured our retail outlet at the distillery to lessen person to person exposure.

OUR WELLNESS INITIATIVEOur coronavirus response is for <u>ALL</u> Lions in our club, young and old, to help your local neighbors *in a <u>safe</u> way for everyone*.

It's about community and problem solving, and being there – especially for shut-ins.

Tune in **tonight, March 26 @ 7PM** if interested in taking action (or, if you're *just curious* about the Deerfield Valley initiative, <u>including safety protocols</u>), but <u>check with Meg</u> beforehand.

This can be an opportunity for everyone, young, old, active or not, <u>from here or from away</u> – even if you're snowbirding. Especially for those wondering how they can make Lions work for them, it's a great opportunity to connect with community.

Dear Club and District Leaders:

Due to all of the health concerns and state government directions, the 2020 Spring Convention has been cancelled. BUT we must continue to proceed with the annual elections for District Officers for 2020 – 2021.

Such elections will be held, via electronic / video conference on Saturday, May 2nd, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. ending approximately 3:30 p.m. if not sooner.

This conference will be held via 'Zoom' website and can be attended via internet connections or via telephone. Attendees to such conference will be limited to District Leadership: DG, CT and elections committee, candidates for the officer positions to be elected, Lions making required nominations for such officer positions, designated delegates from each District 45 club and Past District Governors who are voting but not a delegate for their club.

If there is any Lion interested in running for a District Officer position for 2020 - 2021 and have not announced their candidacy, they must contact IPDG Liz Fenwick at <u>ea.fenwick@gmail.com</u> by no later than April 15th. No nominations other than from those who have announced their candidacy will be accepted as part of the conference.

I must remind all clubs that all outstanding balances need to be paid in full to Lions Clubs International and to Vermont Lions District 45 prior to the election that weekend. Each club is entitled to a delegate vote for each 10 members it has. Club presidents / secretaries will be notified of how many delegates their clubs have. All PDG's in attendance are allowed to vote as a delegate for their club or as a Past District Governor but not both.

DG Ken, CT (and acting CS) Dianne and I look forward to seeing / hearing all delegate representatives of their clubs in the district for this very special conference, as it is an important matter of electing our District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor for 2020 – 2021.


