A Message from District Governor Debra Savery

We are one month into the new Lion year and what a month it's been. One year to the day, Vermont has suffered yet another devastating flood. This time, the storm swept across the entire central portion of the state hitting Barre and surrounding areas with devastation reminiscent of one year ago. District 45 was on the ball then and is on the ball again, obtaining another \$10,000 grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) which, at the time of this writing is already almost half used. I suspect the balance will be used over the next couple of weeks with additional purchases of water, cleaning supplies and food. Emails have been sent to 35 additional communities affected by the storm letting them know that Vermont Lions are once again available to help support the clean-up efforts with supplies and people power if needed. They now know, where there is a need, there is a Lion.

The first Forum and Cabinet meeting is scheduled for August 3rd. Information and registration forms were included in the July issues of the Communique, but it's not too late to let us know you will be coming. Please send an email to CST John Tiholiz at jctiholiz@gmail.com Accurate head counts are essential when trying to ensure enough supplies and food are available for everyone present.

Trainings are being offered during the morning Forum portion of the day with the Cabinet meeting being scheduled for the afternoon. We are hoping to offer a "Basic Intro to Vision Screening" session with the new Plusoptix Vision Screener as well as a session on the new Portal usage. Trainings and activities will be ongoing at future Forums. I hope to cover as many of the global causes during the Forums as possible.

And don't forget the service activity. PDG Carol and FVDG Tanya have a fun activity planned so there will be plenty of activities to choose from. They have also done a great deal of research and have come up with "Quick Start Service Ideas" if you're looking for an impactful service activity that doesn't take a lot of time, volunteers or funding. If you're building a new club, revitalizing an existing club, or just looking for something new, these two Lions are the people to speak to. They are the Global Service Team coordinators, and they would love to help you put the spark back into your club meetings.

So, let's make this first Forum and Cabinet meeting a huge success and come and see what's new in District 45.

Vision Screening Report August 2024

The summer is flying by, and the children will soon be back in school... and the Vermont Lions are poised to start the now "tradition" of vision screening in many of the schools throughout our district. You have your schedules. You have your cameras. You have questions. This is normal with new equipment but know that trainings will be ongoing throughout the year. The most important point I'd like to make, however, is this: If your club does not feel comfortable or does not think it has the time to include the acuity testing this year, it is not required by the District. Over the years most of you have had the opportunity to build good relationships with the school nurses you have worked with. Use that to see if acuity testing could be comfortably integrated into your schedule. But, again, if your club chooses NOT to do acuity testing its OK.

As for the concern regarding confidentiality, the new cameras may ask for a birthdate instead of an age, but no names are ever used, only numbers for bookkeeping purposes and that is not going to cause any HIPPA situations. For example, I can give you a dozen dates and a dozen numbers and I can guarantee you will never be able to identify a single individual with those stats.

Last point, please send your vision screening reports to me, PCST Bruce Savery at bsavery29@gamil.com. Last year we did over 20000 screenings. Let's try to break that tremendous feat this year.
