

Shard Villa gets funding for new stair chair lift

SALISBURY — The Middlebury Lions Club was able to step forward with a \$10,000 donation to help kick start the critical stair chair replacement at Shard Villa.

Nestled in a picturesque setting, ShardVilla is a non-profitresidential care home housed in a stunning 1870s Second Empire mansion. It has served as a beloved a care facility for over 100 years, offering residents a home-like atmosphere surrounded by breathtaking views of the Adirondacks and beautifully maintained grounds.

For years, a stair chair has been an essential feature for residents living on the second floor, providing access to common areas such as the dining room, living room, sunroom, and deck. However, after decades of use, the stair chair has reached the end of its

lifespan and needs to be replaced after numerous repairs.

The cost of removing the old stair chair and installing a new one came to \$23,535 — a significant but necessary expense for Shard Villa. The Middlebury Lions donation will go a long way toward covering the cost of the replacement. With the support of organizations like the Middlebury Lions Club, the facility can continue its mission of offering residents a dignified and comfortable home.

To honor him the staff and employees sold Middlebury Lions cash calendars in his name...249 of them. Then their foundation donated an additional \$2,500 to our service account. All told that's \$7,480 for our community projects.



To All Club Presidents, Club Secretaries and Past District Governors

The Election of District 45 Officers: District Governor, 1st Vice District Governor and 2nd Vice District Governor is to be done at the annual Spring Convention on May 30-June 1 as part of the business meeting to be held Saturday, May 31, 2025.

Club Delegate Formula: Each chartered club in good standing in Lions Club International and this District shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1 alternate for each ten (10 members), who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club or major fraction thereof, of said club as shown on the records of the international office on the first day of the month preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction referred to in this section shall be five (5) or more members. Each certified delegate present in person shall be entitled to one (1) vote only for each office to be filled by, and one (1) vote for each question submitted to, the respective convention. Unless otherwise specified herein, the affirmative vote of a majority of the delegates voting on any question shall be the act of the convention. All delegates must be members in good standing of a club in good standing in this district.

Attached is a list of each club and number of delegates, alternatives plus the Past District Governors for each club. A Past District Governor may cast a ballot as a club delegate OR as a Past District Governor but not both.

Please let us know by May 25 who your club delegates are. Please also let us know if the Past District Governor(s) for your club are going to be voting as a delegate for your club or if they are voting individually.

We look forward to seeing everyone in West Lebanon at the Fireside Inn and Suites for this very important election. And hearing from you in regarding to your club representation. Attached you will find bios on the candidates for each position along with details about the 2025 Spring Convention.
