Dear Fellow Lion Leaders.

Last year at this time I remember thinking that I had a whole year to try to support the growth of D45. Suddenly that year has finished, and it has gone so quickly! It has been a real privilege to be able to visit so many Clubs and share in your celebrations and acknowledge leadership and service in your communities. District 45 has made amazing progress and growth – You should be proud of your work and dedication.

Now, I would like each of you to **reflect and think** about what has changed for you this year:

- What has worked to enable you to grow your Club and increase your service to your communities and what has made a difference to you and your Club.
- What has not has been as successful as you have wished and what were the 'roadblocks' that held you up -

From this reflection, I suggest that you put together a plan that looks forward. This plan will give you targets /goals that can be put into a timeline. Without these targets, you will not have anything to aim for.... I would love to hear from you on what conclusions you come to and how you will use these insights to grow you Clubs and increase your Service. Also, it is important to let us know how the District Officers can help you to achieve your goals.

The following is a review of the targets that I set for D45 for the year ending on June 30th.

D 45 will plan and execute day training for Club Officers in the specific areas of role expectations, leadership skills and conflict resolution skills.

Outcome: Training done in June 2018

D 45 will have 5 more total members at the end of June 2019 than were registered as 2. members in June, 2018, 45% of total members being women

> Outcome: As of the end of May 2019 we have met the goal in growth of numbers, but not yet in % of women members.

Each Club will plan and produce a service project in each of the 5 Service areas

Outcome: So far more than half of our Clubs have completed the challenge.

D45 will recognize and send for training 2 Lions to ALLI and 4 to ELLI and 4 to the USA Canada Forum.

Outcome: Places were offered, with 1 Lion sent to ALLI and 1 Lion sent to ELLI. USA Canada Forum was attended

D45 will achieve a 60% participation by the Clubs in the work of LCIF, as shown by 5. donations to the Foundation.

Outcome: This is to be reported at the beginning of July

My goal for next year is to work with DGE Ken Emery, as part of his team, to keep D45 moving forward in service to our communities. - Driven To Serve!!




