




Zone 3BC: Readsboro Lions were recognized for their service.

What: Lions Clubs International will celebrate 74 years of partnership with the United Nations by holding two Lions Day with the United Nations events to take place in New York, USA and Geneva, Switzerland. These events will commemorate our long-standing relationship as a consultative NGO to the UN dating back to 1945 when Lion leaders were asked to help develop the NGO charter for the UN.

When: Saturday, 7 March 2020 will be the 42nd Lions Day with the United Nations

Where: New York, New York at United Nations Headquarters

Logistics:

- **Registration:** not yet open!
- **Hotel:** typically a room block is secured at the Millennium Hilton New York One Plaza Hotel located in Midtown East—conveniently located across the street from the UN. Details to follow!

The 26th annual VLC meeting to District 45 was presented at 1:44 pm on Saturday, November 9, 2019 by PDG/President of VLC, Stan Patch.

Mission of VLC remains the same; to help clubs within District 45 and assist individuals where there are no clubs. VLC continues to serve as a 501 3 c.

Accomplishments in 2019: there is continued success with the Kids Vision program, thanks to visioneers. VLC covers funds for maintenance of the cameras as well as insurance and if additional vision screeners/cameras should be needed. Thanks to Deb Savery, acting coordinator of the vision screening project.

Club donations: \$5934.00

Pediatric cancer donations: \$5582.00 To date there have been 13 \$500 stipends to families in D-45. We can expect to see that again with the 2nd year request from those same families.

Eye glass requests areas with no clubs: \$1189.00.

Fund raising: Thanks to Troy and Area for the Texas Hold'em \$620.00 and
VLC Bingo \$1487.70

Thanks to Lions Carmelita and Lyle-Cash Fest \$2511.00

Thanks to PCST Bruce -Money Tree \$1550.00

Shared vision donations: \$1500.00

Account Balance is solid: \$412,000.00

2019 Budget is a concern as projected income \$51,900.00 and to date we have \$27,355.00 (short \$24,500.00)

Projected expenses: \$55,900.00 and through September have spent \$45,704.00 leaving \$11,000.00. Budget leaves us a little nervous. January 1- December 31 hope to improve projected income.

VLC will need to elect a President and Vice President at the January Cabinet meeting. (President term -3 years and Vice President term 2 years) Qualifications for either must be the same as for the District Governor-having been club President, Zone Chair, or member of cabinet higher than Zone Chair. PDG/VLC President Stan Patch will be stepping down the middle of January.

Lion Woody was asked to come forward to accept donations from Heartland Lions , Essex Lions, Brandon-Forest Dale, and Londonderry Tri Mountain.

Norwich Lions

Here is a short bio for Helen Keller.

Born in Tuscumbia, Alabama, USA, in 1880, Helen Keller developed a fever at 18 months of age that left her blind and deaf.

With the help of an exceptional teacher, Anne Mansfield Sullivan of the Perkins School for the Blind, Helen Keller learned sign language and braille. A few years later, she learned to speak. As an adult she became a tireless advocate for people with disabilities. And in 1925, she attended the Lions Clubs International Convention and challenged Lions to become "knights of the blind in the crusade against darkness."

The Lions accepted her challenge and our work ever since has included sight programs aimed at preventable blindness. As a result, Lions Clubs International sponsors thousands of programs for the blind and visually impaired around the world each year. This is a story about the Norwich Lions Club doing its part in this tireless effort.

During the month of November, the Norwich Lions Club (NLC) conducted vision screening for 532 children and 10 adults at three elementary schools -- Marion Cross (Norwich), Newton (Stafford) and Sharon (Sharon).

During the screening process 52 children and one adult evidenced screening results which recommended a referral to an eye care professional for follow up services. Arrangements for screening of the children was ably coordinated by the respective School Nurses: Pam Hausler, RN; Kerri Juergens, RN and Jill Lloyd, RN.

Eight Norwich Lions Visioneer's (Steve Flanders, Sean Kenny, Demo Sofronas, Cheryl Brush, Richard Neugass, Brion McMullan, Phil Wheeler and Gary De Gasta) and a spouse-volunteer (Donna Wheeler) conducted the screenings. Assistance was provided at the Newton School by three Strafford Area Lions (Erin Mastellar, Diane White and Tony Pippy).

This was the first year the Sharon Elementary School took advantage of the FREE Lions Club vision screening program.

The Norwich Lions Club is proud to be the host club for one of several \$7500.00 SPOT Vision Screening Cameras owned by District 45 (Vermont Lions Clubs) and strategically placed at Lions Clubs throughout the State. The NLC has a dozen trained Visioneers willing and able to provide FREE vision screening, primarily to children of area schools. 




