Whitingham-Halifax Lions host successful cycling tour, raise \$32,000 for charity



On September 29, the Whitingham-Halifax Lions Club hosted its 7th Annual Hungry Lion Bike Tour (HLBT) in Southern Vermont. The ride attracted more than 120 cyclists from across New England and raised more than \$32,000 for local Lions club projects, including hunger relief, services for seniors and vision testing in local schools. “This was our most successful Bike Tour ever,” said ride chair Julie Muller. “We’re very grateful to everyone who rode, and everyone who donated or sponsored a rider. Thank you!”

To date, the Hungry Lion Bike Tour has raised more than \$130,000, making it the largest charity cycling event in the Deerfield Valley.




