All of our sessions are overnight camps that are located in beautiful Brattleboro, VT. We sleep in cabins, hike on acres upon acres of trails, catch frogs in our pond, and play games on our two huge fields. Memories are made and forever friendships are formed in an environment of total communication access. The primary language used at camp is American Sign Language (ASL) and we guide and encourage new signers to practice and use ASL to foster an environment of access and inclusion.
